

Bronze DoE at St Bernard's?

The DoE is a nationally recognised Award in 3 progressive levels – Bronze, Silver and Gold. The programme is designed to encourage – Leadership; Teamwork; Self-motivation; Communication and Confidence.

The Award is made up of 4 sections:

- 3 months Volunteering – done in school at this level
- 3 months Physical – completed with the Team during the Autumn Term
- 2 Expeditions, Practice and Assessment, each covering 15 miles over 2 days with 2 nights under canvas – completed with the Team in the Summer Term
- 6 months Skill – this is a non-physical hobby which students need to complete themselves.

Bronze DoE is open to Year 9 students at St Bernard's High School. We meet every Thursday from 4.00pm – 6.00pm in BH1 and regular attendance is a requirement of the Award. This is particularly important in the Spring Term as we will be completing safety training for the Expedition.

The staff Team work with students during the year on 3 of the 4 sections. We are fortunate at St Bernard's to have a very dedicated and skilled Team who are able to help students complete Expeditions at Bronze, Silver and Gold level.

Participants **must** be able to attend both Expedition dates:-

- 15-17 May 2020
- 19-21 June 2020

DoE is self-financing. The costs involved are as follows:-

- Registration with DoE - £34.00 (paid around the end of October)
- Two Expeditions, total cost – expected to be around £80-90.00 dependent on numbers (paid around Easter)

All Expedition kit is provided with the exception of:-

- Sleeping bag
- Roll mat
- Walking Boots (not compulsory at Bronze level)
- Plate/cup/cutlery
- Most Expedition food.

The Expedition section is tough. Only 1% of young people nationally actually complete a Bronze Award. At St Bernard's, the DoE is very popular, but some students, particularly those who are less fit, will find it more of a challenge. Over the years some schools have reduced the distance at Bronze level. However, St Bernard's have made a conscious decision to keep the Bronze Expedition at a challenging level. This ensures that those students who go on to Silver and Gold know what to expect and have the skills to achieve these Awards. Along the way we aim to have fun, even if we all come back totally exhausted (staff as well!).

It is therefore up to every student and their parents to decide whether DoE at St Bernard's is for them. Further information will be sent home as numbers settle.
